

- “...*the two recounted what had taken place on the way and how he was made known to them in the breaking of bread.*”
- Such a wonderful Gospel passage we have today as we celebrate the reception of First Holy Communion for our young ones.
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- First of all...congratulations to all of you young ones receiving your 1st Communion today...and welcome to all of you who have come to celebrate this day with them.
- This is one of the greatest days of your life—the day that you first receive Jesus Himself in this wonderful sacrament of the Eucharist.
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- You are a bit young to realize the greatness of this day in your lives...and, really, none of us can truly understand fully the greatness of the Eucharist and of communion with Him.
- The Church teaches us that it is:
 - the sacrament of sacraments...the source and summit of the Christian life...
 - ...and in the “blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ Himself...” (CCC 1324)...
 - ...it is the sacrifice Christ offered once for all on the cross remaining ever present...for which we give thanks with all our hearts.
- The word “Eucharist” itself means “thanksgiving”.
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- After the priest consecrates it, that little wafer is no longer bread... the liquid in the chalice is no longer wine...but truly they are the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Himself—God Himself.

- “*But it still looks like, smells like, tastes like bread and wine!*”
- Yes, but Jesus tells us: “*This is my body; this is my blood.*”
- We know it is His Body and Blood because Jesus—God!—tells us it is! and has made it so...He who leads us into all truth.

- Jesus—who with the Father and the Holy Spirit created the universe—comes to be in this little wafer...just for you...to be with YOU. He loves you that much.
- That why it’s so important to always do good and to follow what Jesus teaches us. When we sin, we are pushing God out the back door...and opening the front door for evil.
- If a hungry bear came around your house, would you open the door and let him in? Of course not!...because you know that he would destroy your house...and then he would come after YOU!
- Well...that is what the devil does when we let him into the house of our bodies and souls...he wrecks our house more and more the longer we let him stay.
- So always seek the good and run from evil...because God loves you so very deeply, and always wants only the best for you.
