


Join us for a special opportunity to prepare for...

## Consecration to St. Joseph

Thursdays in Parish Hall

after 5:30 p.m. Mass:

April 8, 15, 22, 29 and May 6



Participants will read a short passage each day and then join in small group discussions Thursday evenings until consecration with Fr. John after Thursday evening's mass on May 13 (Our Lady of Fatima)

Note: April 8 will only be a short 20-minute introduction to welcome participants and present information on the book, meeting format and schedule.

We will be meeting on Thursday evenings from approximately 6:15 to 7:15 p.m., opening with a 20-minute video\* about St. Joseph followed by small group discussions on readings from the book ***Consecration to St. Joseph: The Wonders of Our Spiritual Father*** by Fr. Donald Calloway, MIC. Participants should purchase the book before the kick-off meeting on April 8, so that they will be ready for Day One of consecration on April 11. Individuals are welcome to bring their own dinner and beverage to the meetings. COVID Safe Practices set forth by the Archdiocese and State of NM will be observed.

*About the book...*

*Drawing on the wealth of the Church's living tradition, Fr. Calloway calls on all of us to turn to St. Joseph, entrust ourselves, our Church, and our world to our spiritual father's loving care, and then watch for wonders when the Universal Patron of the Church opens the floodgates of Heaven to pour out graces into our lives today. Definitely a book for our time, Consecration to St. Joseph is dedicated to meeting the challenges of the present moment and restoring order to our Church and our world, all through the potent paternal intercession and care of St. Joseph.*
